

DCPS regulations are pending to expand access into pre-Kindergarten for colocated Early Head Start recipients.

Current language in MSDC Policy Guide:

United Planning
Organization (UPO)
Guarantee (DCPS only)

Guaranteed match for applicants currently attending UPO's early childhood program when they apply to the DCPS PK3 at the same school.

Eligibility is based on verification by DCPS. DCPS provides a list of applicants that are enrolled in the UPO program, and should receive the guarantee.

Proposed language in MSDC Policy Guide:

Early Head Start Co-location Guarantee (DCPS only)

Guaranteed match at a DCPS school for PK3 applicants currently receiving services from a service provider that is co-located in the DCPS school to which they are applying. Applicants must be eligible to receive Early Head Start services to receive this preference.

Eligibility is based on verification by DCPS. DCPS provides a list of applicants that are enrolled in with the service provider's Early Head Start program and should receive the guarantee.






Overall application numbers are down 36% relative to the same time last year; with most of the decline driven by PK3-8 applications

Note: Data compares 01/26/2021 vs. 01/27/2020





- DC Council unanimously passed Bill 23-0717, the "Expanding Equitable Access to Great Schools Act of 2020" and Mayor signed on Dec 7, 2020
- Included in legislation:
 - Preference data to be published on MSDC website (amendment 10/20)
 - At-risk definition to match UPSFF definition
- 13 PCS expressed interest in implementing a preference for at-risk students
- PCSB policy is being formulated
- Military preference (authorized in 2016) to be implemented for the first time at LEARN PCS in Ward 8 on Bolling Air Force Base






Virtual EdFEST 2020



EdFEST was virtual on December 12th

- Three-hour live Saturday event (11AM 2PM) with materials for 30 days after
- Developed with LEA and PAC input
 - Top benefits to EdFEST: (1) Direct engagement, and (2) Recruitment
 - "Must haves": (1) Easy to use platform, (2) Mobile-friendly, and (3) Language access

- LEA Marketing Toolkit









Virtual EdFEST Results

Virtual EdFEST Survey Results



Exhibitor Survey (93 respondents)

- 72% overall satisfaction vs. 93% in 2019
- 68.4% overall satisfaction with the platform (Accelevents)
- 78% overall found the event to be organized vs. 92% in 2019
- 80% prefer in-person to virtual EdFEST

Participant Survey (203 respondents)

- 59% overall satisfaction vs. 92% in 2019
- 77% found the event helpful vs.
 98% in 2019
- 77% found a school they would research further vs. 94% in 2019
- 60% prefer in-person to virtual EdFEST
- Most attendees found out about the event from MSDC

Virtual EdFEST Lessons



What would we continue?

- Multi-pronged and multilingual marketing strategies, including phone banking
- Partnership work with LEAs, government and community partners
- "How to" videos on how to plan for and navigate EdFEST
- Provide the school directory at EdFEST

What would we start?

- Enhance the MSDC website to save exhibitor booth material from EdFEST
- Free online registration through Eventbrite or other site to capture attendee data

What would we stop?

Staff differently for virtual or hybrid event and start uploads earlier in the fall
